

# National Professional Qualification for Leading Teaching (NPQLT)

**NPQLT is a new qualification for teachers who have, or are aspiring to have, responsibilities for leading teaching in a subject, year group, key stage or phase.**

This NPQ is:

- Underpinned by the latest evidence of what works in improving teaching and outcomes for children and young people
- Delivered flexibly to ensure you can invest in your own professional development alongside your existing commitments
- Directly relevant and applicable to your current roles
- Career-building – preparing you for future roles and helping you to build strong professional networks that will sustain you
- Designed for teachers from a wide range of settings
- Focused on the skills needed to implement and sustain change and improvement

**The course curriculum will support you to develop expertise that is flexible and allows you to respond to the challenges you will encounter in a range of contexts. It will provide you with a network, common language and access to a continuous debate through which the collective expertise of our education system can grow and develop.**

**The course will cover important areas of study including:**

- How to explain important ideas about how pupils learn to colleagues and support colleagues to help pupils
- How to support colleagues to design a carefully sequenced, broad and coherent curriculum
- How to support colleagues to avoid common assessment pitfalls, design school assessment systems and manage them without creating additional workload
- How to contribute to effective professional development linked to teaching, curriculum and assessment across the school.
- How to plan and execute implementation in stages including how to make the right choices on what to implement, prepare appropriately for the changes to come and make those changes sustainable.
