

National Professional Qualification for Senior Leadership (NPQSL)

This qualification will support you to develop expertise that is flexible, and which enables you to respond to the challenges you will encounter as a Senior Leader. Expertise that can be applied to both identifying and addressing persistent and common challenges whatever your school context. It will also provide you with a network, common language and access to a continuous debate through which the collective expertise of our education system can grow and develop.

This NPQ is:

- Underpinned by the latest evidence of what works in improving teaching and outcomes for children and young people
- Delivered flexibly to ensure you can invest in your own professional development alongside your existing commitments
- Directly relevant and applicable to your current roles
- Career-building – preparing you for future roles and helping you to build strong professional networks that will sustain you
- Designed for teachers from a wide range of settings
- Focused on the skills needed to implement and sustain change and improvement

The NPQSL curriculum will support you to both 'learn that' and 'learn how to' and explore elements of the role of a senior leader like:

- How to support colleagues to engage with carefully designed and sequenced curricula and assessment practices, without creating unnecessary workload
- How to contribute to the prioritisation, allocation and management of resources (including financial, human and educational) to ensure sustainability whilst also recruiting, developing, supporting and appropriately managing colleagues
- How to plan and execute implementation in stages, prepare appropriately for the changes to come, deliver changes and ensure they are sustainable
- How to contribute to working in partnership with multiple stakeholders including other schools and school trusts alongside the community and other organisations including professional associations and local authorities.
