How will I be assessed?

There are two success criteria for the course:

- Participation in at least 90% of the course
- Successfully pass the summative case study assessment

The summative assessment requires you to answer three questions in response to a case study. The assessment windows are set at the start of your course and there is an 8-day period to complete the assessment.

Modules

The course is comprised of three modules over 12 months. Each module lasts 12 weeks. The modules cover all of the 'learn that and learn how to' statements from the NPQ Leading Teacher Development Framework Document.

Module 1: Teaching, Curriculum and Assessment

Module 2: Deliver and implement effective teacher development

Module 3: Sustaining and evaluating teacher development
